# **How-to use for CEQA Initial Screening**



I need to know how to use the Greenprint to perform an initial assessment for my project site. What layers are relevant to the CEQA environmental checklist (Appendix G)?

## 1. Go to <a href="mailto:bayareagreenprint.org/report/">bayareagreenprint.org/report/</a>

### 2. Select your area.




Under **Draw an Area**, you have three options to show your project location:

- If your project is best defined by a polygon, use Draw a shape to capture project coverage area.
- If you have a point location, use Drop a pin and select a ⅓-mile buffer (includes search by address)
- If your project is linear (like a trail), use **Draw a line** and select a 1/4-mile buffer

Use Upload a shape if you have a Shapefile (GIS) or KML (from Google Earth) of your project area.

## 3. After you have run your report, download the CEQA Checklist document

- Greenprint CEQA Checklist
- 4. Fill out the checklist to determine what issue areas require further investigation on your project site.



#### For example,

- Evaluate project impacts related to Air Quality by where your project might expose project users in
  Urban Greening's Air Pollution Risk or Air Quality impacts to open space that provide Sequestration
  of PM2.5 or NO2 (air pollutants) by Vegetation services.
- Identify your project site's important biological resources by going the Greenprint report section, **Biodiversity & Habitat**, to find nearly all relevant layers for a biological screening
- Identify existing and planned recreational resources for your project site by going the **Recreation** section of the Greenprint report to see if more about regional trail plans and bicycle routes
- Identify applicable open space policies to your project, review the different sections of the Greenprint report to see if an Open Space Policy is present at the project site and click on a policy to find out more in the Glossary
